

Alesis opens its Trust Centre as SOC 2, ISO 27001 and ISO 42001 audits get under way

The AI assistant for UK law firms publishes the live status of the standards it is being audited against, its policies and its sub-processors, for any firm's due diligence

Chester, England, 19 August 2026. L25 Limited has opened a Trust Centre for Alesis, its AI assistant for UK law firms, at trust.alesis.ai. The Trust Centre publishes the live status of the independent standards Alesis is being audited against, the policies behind them, and the list of sub-processors, so that a firm's COLP, insurers or IT reviewers can check the position for themselves.

Alesis is compliant with UK GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018. Its audit periods for SOC 2 Type 2, ISO 27001 and ISO 42001 are under way. A SOC 2 report and an ISO certificate are issued at the end of an audit period, not the start of one; Alesis is in that period now, and the Trust Centre shows where each standard stands.

ISO 42001 is the standard written for organisations that build and run AI. It asks how a system is designed, watched, governed and corrected: the questions a compliance officer asks before trusting an assistant with client work. SOC 2 Type 2 examines how the information firms hand over is protected over a period of months rather than on a single day, and ISO 27001 is the international standard for managing information security: knowing what you hold, who can reach it, what could go wrong and what you would do about it.

From upload to answer, a firm's information is held in the UK and processed only in the UK and the EU. Each firm's work is kept apart from every other firm's, and nothing a firm uploads, asks or drafts is used to train anything for anyone else. Inside a firm, people see only the matters they are on: seniority does not grant a view, and even a firm owner sees a matter only once they are added to it. Every account proves its email address before it can work, only a firm's own addresses are accepted, and every account can add two-factor authentication and passkeys. Every answer keeps the sources it rested on, so a firm can show afterwards what was relied on and where it came from.

"Careful firms ask the same questions in the same order: where does our information go, who can see it, and what do you do with it," said Luke Roberts, director of L25 Limited. "The Trust Centre answers them in the open, with the audits under way and the status of each shown as it stands. Whatever a COLP, an insurer or an IT reviewer needs beyond that, they can send to us and have back in writing."

Due diligence questionnaires can be sent to hello@l25.ai; every answer comes back in writing, signed by the people responsible for it. The security page at alesis.ai/security sets out the position in full.
